Tips for supporting your child's education:

Why is quick number fact recall so important?

- Automatic recall of basic number facts is generally considered to be a key foundation for higher-order math skills.
- Basic number facts are the answers to simple equations in addition (e.g. $3 + 2$), subtraction (e.g. $9 - 5$), multiplication (e.g. 6×4), and division (e.g. $15 \div 3$).
- When children have automatic recall of these facts, they can quickly retrieve answers from their long-term memory without having to rely on counting strategies, such as counting on fingers. For information to be stored in the long term memory, daily revision is needed at school and at home.
- Lack of quick number recall creates problems as children advance to later stages, because the need to rely on laborious counting strategies create a drain on the cognitive thinking needed for learning more advanced mathematics.
- At school, daily focus is given to automatic recall of addition and subtraction facts. This does not have to add to the weekly home learning load...a simple game in the car to- and from school will do just the job!

To support this processes we will be introducing Numeracy @ Home activities in Term 3. During Term 2 Mrs Flannery is volunteering in the school and setting up homework, games based fun Maths activities!
