Principal's News

Welcome to Week 10 and July! A very chilly morning this morning and we still have had several students arriving without jumpers or jackets! Sorry for the repeat ... I understand that homes and cars are very well heated, as are our classrooms, but the students are still spending time outside each day and the appropriate clothes are vital in this very cold weather. If your child is not wearing their jumper or jacket please ensure it is in their bag. Thank you for your support.

This week marks the beginning of NAIDOC events in schools across our area. This year's theme is Voice, Treaty, Truth: The Indigenous voice of this country is over 65,000 plus years old. They are the first words spoken on this continent. Languages that passed down lore, culture and knowledge for over millennia. They are precious to our nation. And with 2019 being celebrated as the United Nations International Year of Indigenous Languages, it's time for our knowledge to be heard through our voice. Voice. Treaty. Truth. were three key elements to the reforms set out in the <u>Uluru Statement from the Heart.</u> These reforms represent the unified position of First Nations Australians. However, the Uluru Statement built on generations of consultation and discussions among Indigenous people on a range of issues and grievances. It specifically sequenced a set of reforms: first, a First Nations Voice to Parliament enshrined in the Constitution and second, a Makarrata Commission to supervise treaty processes and truth-telling. (Makarrata is a word from the language of the Yolngu people in Arnhem Land. The Yolngu concept of Makarrata captures the idea of two parties coming together after a struggle, healing the divisions of the past. It is about acknowledging that something has been done wrong, and it seeks to make things right.) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people want their voice to be heard. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have always wanted an enhanced role in decision-making in Australia's democracy. Let's work together for a shared future. This week our Year 6 and Aboriginal students will travel to Dungog High School for our combined Dungog & District Community of Schools event and on the first Wednesday of Term 3 we will be participating in our Clarence Town Public School NAIDOC Event.

The outside work for our Seismic Activity reinforcement of our chimneys work has now been completed. After a week and a half we are back in the office areas and I would like to thank my staff for their resilience and patience while our staffroom area was the foyer, front 'window', Administration Office, Principal's Office, Assistant Principal's Office, Counsellor's Office, sick bay and lunch room area. Being the end of the financial year and end of term and managing without the normal realm of resources (we didn't even have access to the photocopier!) was a difficult and challenging time and I thank you for your patience as well. The scaffold and fencing will be removed this week and the contractors will return in the holidays to complete the interior work.

Due to a variety of extenuating circumstances the evacuation drill on Thursday had to be postponed. This will be a surprise drill and students will be informed of the day it will be happening (This Wednesday) but not the specific time. Students will be in classrooms during this time and classroom teachers will review the processes with each class prior to the event and I will address morning assemblies to remind students of why these drills are important to keep us all safe.

Last Thursday the Swap It staff attended school to undertake the first aspect of this initiative – thank you to those parents who responded in the affirmative to the survey or during Mrs Allen phone calls. They did a 10 minute address to each class, survey our senior students and photographed lunch boxes to obtain their base line data. Over the coming weeks there will be newsletter items with healthy lunch options and ideas to improve the health food content of lunchboxes. We have a large percentage of students who bring a lunch box full of processed



food, or think that roll ups are fruit and have no lunch option. These highly processed foods and high sugar content foods do not give the children's bodies or brains the minerals and vitamins required for healthy growth and brain development. We are aiming to improve the health food content of the lunch boxes and also reduce the waste created by packaged foods.
